Below, we list the activities carried out by us:

I. Team Integration that supported us in this work: Marriage of Edgar and Cynthia Montalvo Fr. Muñiz Guillermo Vargas.

II. Participation in the training area ICCFM, with the project "Evangelical Solidarity" Mission: San Francisco Javier

As training being the principal axis of the MFC and the lack of training materials for its members and in communion with the Presidents of ICCFM, we proposed a training project named "Evangelical Solidarity", Mission San Francisco Javier, (material for three years of training for married couples). Through Continental Presidents we offered to the countries that would be interested in them. We had responses from India, Philippines, Thailand and a couple from England who works with families and they asked us for support. We met in the EMF (when we attended the meeting in Milan parish). These materials were sent in English, in Word via mail, the first part so that it could adapt to their culture and needs.

Unfortunately we didn't have the feedback from these countries in order we could evaluate its progress.

The material of this project was generously disposed by the national presidents in turn, Ricardo and Lucia Araujo.

C. - We delivered to the countries: Thailand, India, Sri Lanka, Philippines, Malawi, Singapore, and Slovakia.

Dear friends, we understand that is necessary to work on the basic opportunities such as solidarity and communication, which lead us to the experience of Stewardship with the Confed-

eracy.

III. Participation in the Being of ICCFM

We are part of the Committee for updating the ICCFM Constitution and Bylaws. Proposed by Presidents Latin America (SPLA), Luis Carlos and Martita Pinilla and ratified by Gary and Kay Aitchison, ICCFM Presidents.

IV. Participation in the Unification of MFC-MX in the U.S. to MFC-USA.

Background: The MFC-Mexico had been working in the U.S.A. in an organized manner and because of the request of the Archbishop of Los Angeles on duty from 1989 -1992 triennium. By now they had a 1200 families and 200 youths membership in nine dioceses and two dioceses.

In coordination with the national presidents of MFC in Mexico, Lucia and Ricardo Araujo, there was the possibility of unifying





the MFC in the U.S.A. to the MFC-MX. In order to increase an efficient and close attention by the Mexico responsible, specially in the areas of training and operational support.

When we talked with the Mexico presidents, they saw the opportunity to achieve the CFM unity in USA. With this vision, several meetings were held with the National Presidents, Loly and Tony Layton and the National Board, the assistant priest MFCC-USA and a meeting with the Bishop Oscar Cantu who joined this initiative. The process of "unification" of both MFC, runs its course, thanks to God, to the prayers of all and the leadership of the presidents of both countries.

V. Participation in Organizing the "XII World Assembly of Families" and the "XVI ICCFM General Assembly".

1.- At the first meeting of the Organization Secretariat for the integration of all the organizing committees for the "XII World Assembly of Families" and "XVI General Assembly ICCFM". Was carried out in Bucaraman-

ga, Colombia in November 2012, which were agreed the contents of training topics according to selected topic in the XV ICCFM General Assembly, held in the year 2010 in Goa, India: "The Christian Family: Finding our voice in a global society"

2.- Participation in virtual meetings to look for progresses, with the Organization Secretariat.

VI. Participation in Congresses with ICCFM representation.

During these three years we participated in the following events, in all of them as a speakers with a message from the ICCFM Presidents, Gary and Kay Atchison.

1.- "International Family Congress", organized by the Pontifical Council for the Family, Rome, Italy, in November 2010.

2.- "Family National Meeting", as panelists for a workshop table, Loja, Ecuador, November 2011.

3.- The "American XXV General Assembly" AGLA. As coordinators of the development of the

Assembly. La Falda, Argentina, November 2011

4.- "International Family Congress" Madrid, Spain, May 2012

5.- "World Meeting of Families" with the Pope. Held in Milan, Italy, June 2012. In this meeting with the support of the Spain National Presidents was held a meeting of members of the MFC of all countries who attended it. It was in the Milan Parish, where a Rosary was prayed for the unity of the ICCFM families.

6.- Meeting of MFC Priests. BLOCK V. Venue: San Andres Tuxtla Diocese. Held in Villa del Carmen, Mexico Catemaco View. April 2012. "The importance of the participation of the Priest in the MFC"

7.- Participation at the first meeting of the National Team training MFC-Mexico plenary, with the theme "The Charism and Spirituality of MFC"

8.- "XX MFC National Meeting" Monterrey, Mexico, May 2013, where we were invited to participate representing the ICCFM.

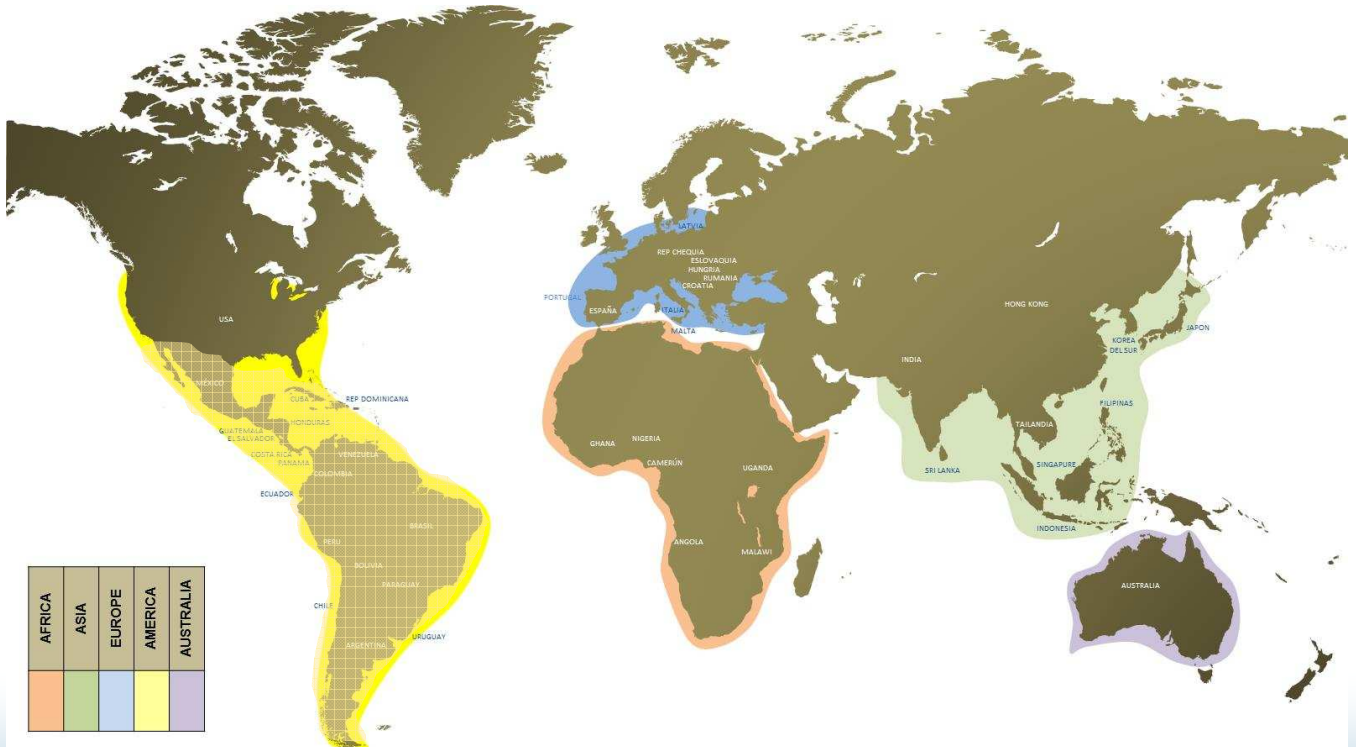
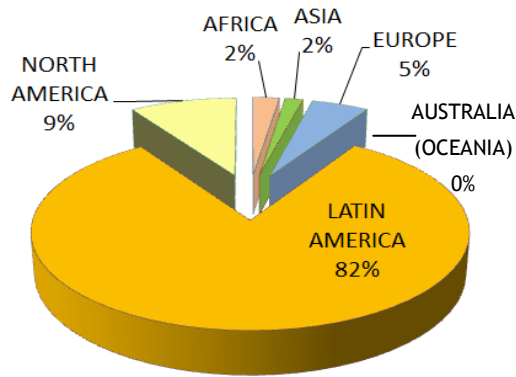

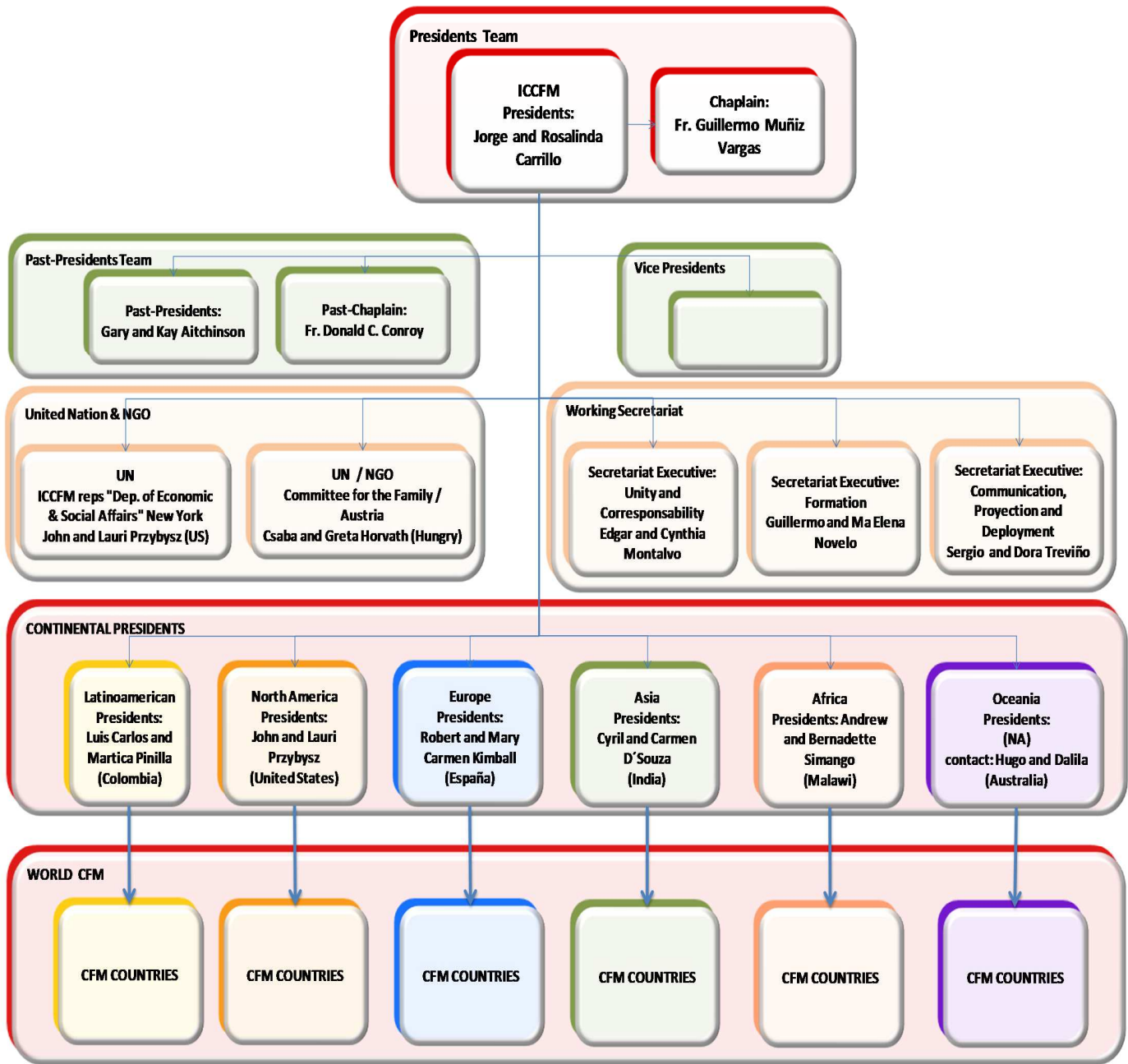

MESSAGE OF ICCFM ECCLESIASTICAL ASSISTANT

Pope Benedict XVI believed that the **secret of the New Evangelization** is collaboration between bishops, priests, religious and laity to renew the original push and love for Christ and for the Church.



At the start of the Work Plan of the New Team that the New World Presidents of ICCFM Led by Marriage of Jorge and Rosy Carrillo and the Chaplain Fr. Guillermo Muñiz Vargas with the mission of **announce the Gospel of Marriage, Family and Life and to make our voice heard in a global world!** Through the ICCFM families.

It is providential that in the "Year of Faith" and the commitment of the New Evangelization to impulse the **Permanent Mission**, with the secret that Pope Benedict XVI that evangelizes is not in isolated from, the example is given by the Apostle Saint Paul, that had as collaborators Silvanus and Timothy, and others like the marriage of Priscilla and Aquila. Hopefully this proposal would be a valuable tool and necessary to continue performing the Permanent Mission to reach all the Marriages and Families, in each of the Continents. Let each one know how to be faithful servants of Jesus Christ's mandate to "Announce the Good News of the love of God in all families around the world" through the International Confederation of Christian Family Movements (ICCFM). Touch to all of us, to be Messengers of God's Love to Marriage and Families.



Pope Francisco recently expressed:

1. The two pastoral categories that arising from the originality of the Gospel and serve us as guidelines for ecclesial life of the missionary discipleship: **proximity and encounter** that is "God nearby" to his people, nearness that reaches the maximum by incarnating. God is who goes out to meet his people. The nearness creates communion and belonging, give rise to the encounter. The nearness takes the form of dialogue and creates a culture of encounter.
2. The missionary disciple lives stressed to the peripheries. In the Gospel message, speaking of "existential peripheries" de-centered, and usually we are afraid to leave the center. The disciple-missionary is an off-center:



the center is Jesus Christ who calls and sends. The disciple is sent to the peripheries existential.

Opening Speech in the Mundial Assembly of ICCFM at Bucaramanga, Colombia. June 28, 2013

The Christian Family Finding Our voice in a Global World



We extend our greetings to you and your families on this historic opening of the 12th World Assembly of the International Confederation of Christian Family Movements. We pray that this gathering will be a source of inspiration and blessing to all who are joined here to participate.

We are grateful to Luis Carlos and Marthica Pinilla and their hard working committee who have planned, and executed this significant event. We know that we will not be disappointed. Will the committee (and all who had anything to do with the Assembly) please stand so that we may acknowledge them and show our appreciation.

We are excited to be meeting in Latin America where the International Confederation of Christian Family Movements was born nearly 60 years ago. Beginning in the 1940's, small discussion-action groups sprang up in various parts of the world, but it was in 1966 in Caracas, Venezuela that the ICCFM was officially launched. ICCFM has returned to Latin America for other assemblies and we are happy to be welcomed back for this 2013 Assembly.

Over the years, CFM/MFC has touched thousands of families and today is active in 48 countries on 5 continents with 100,000 families involved worldwide. The ICCFM was formed with the aim of helping its members live their human and Christian vocations and bear witness to the essential values of the family, based on the Gospel of Jesus Christ and guided by the teachings of the Catholic Church. The CFM/MFC has obviously made an impact on your family and the families in your countries and communities or you would not be here today.

The Confederation is composed of three types of members that fulfill the requirements established in the constitution:

1. Full members of the Confederation are Christian Family Movements which meet the following basic characteristics:

They are organized in small groups of couples, families, solo parents, widows, or any combination of such, who seek to become genuine family communities and work together with their chaplains to promote mutual growth.

They meet regularly, participating in a formative process of Observe, Judge, and Act in the light of God's word.

They witness and minister to all families, especially to those in difficult situations such as the poor and suffering.

2. Associate members are lay organizations which share the Christian ideals of ICCFM and are involved in working for the family.

3. Supporting members are those organizations or centers which share the Christian ideals of the confederation and are involved in the study, research and promotion of the family.

At this Assembly, we have representatives attending from the 4 continents of: Asia, Europe, North America and Latin America. They represent the various aspects of membership in the ICCFM.

ICCFM is governed by a Secretariat made up of: Presidents, Chaplain, Vice-Presidents, a president couple and chaplain from each continent and the past presidents.

ICCFM is connected to the larger Church community as a member of the Pontifical Council on the Laity. It also has the status of an NGO with the United Nations. Csaba and Greta Horvath from Hungary repre-

sent ICCFM on the NGO Committee on the Family in Vienna and John and Lauri Przybysz are delegates to the UN's Committee on the Family in New York.

ICCFM has a visible electronic presence through our website (iccfm.org). The website gives details of the movement including the makeup of the secretariat, membership numbers, history and our newsletter Link/Lazo which is published twice a year in English and Spanish.

CFM/MFC provides families with the resources needed to answer the call to serve Jesus Christ.

- The gospel of Jesus Christ gives us the truths and framework to raise our families in a Christian environment.
- The methodology of CFM gives us the tools to assess the positive and negative effects of societal and cultural influences on our families: by observing what is going on in our environment; and then judging in light of the gospels how to bring society more into balance with Christian beliefs. And finally, by challenging us to take action that will bring about positive change.
- The CFM/MFC experience establishes a Christian community that provides support and affirmation from others with similar beliefs and values.

CFM/MFC is a gift that has impacted thousands of families, helped them to grow and empowered them to reach out in action to their brothers and sisters in Christ. It has provided a wonderful opportunity in which marriage have been strengthened, families have been enriched and individuals have grown in their faith. CFM/MFC has developed leaders and created Christian community.

Over the past 6 decades, MFC/CFM has been and will continue to be a beacon to your families and to the families throughout the world.

The theme of our Assembly The Christian Family: Finding Our Voice in a Global World is extremely timely. If ever the Christian Family needed to exercise its voice, the time is now. We live in a very challenging world that is far from family friendly. Many

cultural and societal changes are not supportive of families. In fact, many are anti-family. Some countries are attempting to redefine marriage in a way that is contrary to the Christian Sacrament of Marriage. Abortion, cohabitation, individualism, materialism, secularism, all have a negative impact on the family. In many parts of the world, families face poverty and hunger and struggle to survive. Justice issues impact the family on all sides. In other places war, oppression, terrorism, displacement, forced migration, and human trafficking are realities. The family is being bombarded by negativity on all sides. The time has come for families to join together and find their voice.

It is fitting that we are meeting here in Latin America for this 12th World and 16th General Assembly - the continent that has given the Church a new Pope. Pope Francis has already shown his dedication to the poor and suffering among us. In Pope Francis we have a role model of the way to follow Jesus and serve. In these few months since his election as pope, his remarks have no doubt challenged many. In his first days as pope, the Holy Father stated his goal as Bishop of Rome: a poor church for the poor of the world. Like Jesus and St. Francis of Assisi - the namesake the Holy Father has chosen to identify himself and his service as Bishop of Rome - the Holy Father has challenged himself and the Church to make the plight of the poor a priority. In his homily inaugurating his ministry Pope Francis declared: "when exercising power [one] must enter more fully into that service which has its radiant culmination on the Cross ...[One] must open [one's] arms to protect all of God's people and embrace with tender affection the whole of humanity, especially the poorest, the weakest, the least important, those whom Matthew lists in the final judgment on love: the hungry, the thirsty, the stranger, the naked, the sick and those in prison." (ct. Mt. 25:31-46)

Those of us who are advocates for the family are called to stand up and make our voices heard and to work for a better quality of life for all the families of the world. This is our challenge as we gather today as a world Assembly of Families.

ICCFM Missioning in the World

With what we have called **Continental Mission San Jose**, ICCFM through their presidents, invites all countries to share training (formation) materials available from them and motivate them to be generous with our brothers from other countries who do not have, making these available for its use as is, or to be adapted to the reality that each one lives and to their pastoral guidelines of the Conferences of Bishops correspondent of each country. To which the ICCFM Presidents Jorge and Rosalinda Carrillo are being commissioned to deliver and share these materials.

An important part of this mission is to go to the countries that are being benefactors, to present what is the confederation, its mission, objectives and highlight the importance of prayer for one another and their support and for the apostolic work, will be continuing developed and carry the evangelization-formation of marriages, families, youth, teenagers, mothers, boyfriends, etc ..., and training materials for the preparation of different pastoral agents that conform the Family groups that belong to the confederation as well, as invite to join us, to other family groups.

Francis Pope encourages us all to be carriers of the good news of Christ, to take it to all corners of the world.

Ulloa , Bishop of Carthage who gave a message to the membership, and within the program Jorge and Rosy presented a formation theme and gave a message to the members of the MFC in this country.

Mexico : So far this semester there have been 6 visits already scheduled to MFC Mexico, in different cities of the country, accompanied by National Presidents Rafael and Raquel Vivian, with the goal of
